### 3. Treat your classroom with love and respect.

***Tauhi ho lokiako 'aki 'a e 'ofa mo e faka'apa'apa'ia.*** (Your classroom is your learning center. Treat the doors, louvres, blackboards/whiteboards, desks, and chairs etc. with care. Other people have made sacrifices to buy you these equipment and furniture to enhance your study. Be grateful and treat them as yours with respect.)

### 4. Fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge.

***Ko e 'apasia 'Otua ko e kamata'anga ia 'o e poto.*** (Whatever you do, do it with reverence for God.)

### 5. Depart from evil and walk in His light.

***Hola mei he kovi; lalaka he 'Ene maama.*** (Whatever is true, noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable, praiseworthy... think about such things.)

## 7.3 Ko ho 'apiako (Your School Environment)


### 1. Your School is your home away from home.
